

The purpose of the Chartered Accountant Board Exam (CABE) – Applied Learning Programme (ALP) is to adequately prepare students to successfully answer SAICA board examination questions.

As such the course will focus on revising previous knowledge and using it to answer past board examination questions. The participants will be expected to do pre-reading and discussions will be facilitated by experts in the respective knowledge areas.
