The Intersections of Rurality and Gender in relation to Violence against Girls and Young Women: An urgent matter in relation to health inequalities in South Africa and Sweden (T-GRAN) project (henceforth referred to as the T-GRAN project) is funded by the South African Medical Research Council and FORTE: Swedish Research Council for Health, Working Life, and Welfare under the SAMRC-FORTE Collaborative Research Programme. The T-GRAN project seeks to appoint one (1) research assistant. Located in the Centre for Visual Methologies for Social Change (CVMSC) at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, the purpose of the T-GRAN project is to develop theoretical constructs to address gender violence in relation to rurality, to use participatory visual methodologies as a way of highlighting the experiences and critical engagement of girls and young women as well as stakeholders and community members in the two country contexts, and to promote extensive, policy-relevant dialogue as it relates to gendered health inequalities.

The research assistant will support the activities of the project team, including assisting with conducting literature searches; transcribing, analyzing, and curating and archiving research data; contributing to publications, and participating in fieldwork.

## **Requirements:**

- An Honour's degree in any field in the Social Sciences and Humanities
- At least one year's experience in a research environment
- Fluency in written and spoken isiZulu, and an interest in health, gender and/or rurality will be an added advantage

The research assistant will be appointed for a period of three (3) months.
