

Programme overview & objectives:

This course is designed for delegates who want to improve their practical knowledge and understanding of South African Sign Language in order to improve their communicative language skills levels. The course reflects the need to address the requirements of the disabled community, and government's requirement for business to employ staff from the disabled community. The course will teach delegates how to communicate effectively with the deaf and hard-of hearing community.

The motivation for offering this course is to assist delegates to achieve an appropriate level of language proficiency in South African Sign Language, which will allow delegates to communicate with the Deaf community.
