LATEX workshop 2018

The workshop is aimed at senior undergraduate and graduate students to assist them with the presentation of assignments, published work and the production of their theses.

Although the scope of the workshop is quite large, no prior knowledge of LATEX is assumed. The information provided on each subject should enable the student to produce workable code, and wherever practical, provide pointers to extended implementations and more advanced topics. The emphasis will be on practical implementation and frequently encountered problems in the production of academic work. Instruction will, where practical, be in the form of self-contained worked examples, which can then serve as templates for structures within a larger document.

The workshop will consist of four three-hour sessions held over two days. A rough guideline of the topics to be covered is given in the table below. Many topics will be revisited when relevant concepts have been developed.
