Disaster Preparedness, Response & Reduction (DPRR)

In this session, participants will be briefly review the conceptual framework and implications for practice through the disaster preparedness, response and risk reduction (DPRR) cycle. They will gain an understanding of present global occupational therapy actions in relation to disaster management though examples. They will have the opportunity to share experiences, ideas, and practical innovation related to occupation and human rights in disaster response, recovery and preparedness contexts. They will critically reflect on occupational therapy competencies and professional development needs. By the end of the session, participants should have a better understand of the roles and challenges of occupational therapists' involvement in disaster management and ways forward.
