

4th ANNUAL DISABILITY SUPPORT RESEARCH INDABA

Africa and it's intersections with cultural, social, political and historical diversities has shown much research activity on the unique experiences of persons with disabilities in all spheres of human functioning. Aside from this, the emerging and growing cohort of researchers with disabilities shows promise for reframing disability knowledge production from the African continent. Hence, this 4th Annual Disability Research Indaba shifts the research focus to situating disability within an Afrocentric perspective.

Current African disability epistemologies highlight the influence of power hierarchies, cultural and universal tensions, poverty, gender-based violence, barriers to education and many other cross-cutting societal injustices that constrain the human development of persons with disabilities in Africa.

In noting this, the 4th Annual Disability Research Indaba, to be held at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, opens conversations through participation, dialogue and reasoning which aims to focus on the themes below.
