**Prof Bulie Magula** is HOD of Internal Medicine at UKZN. After completing her Specialist training at UKZN, she was awarded the Fogarty Fellowship to study an MSc in Clinical Research at the Sackler School of Graduate Biomedical Sciences, Tufts University, Boston, Massachusetts, USA. On her return to South Africa, she was awarded the Discovery Foundation Fellowship and the SA MRC Self-Initiated Research grant and completed her PhD at UKZN titled "Metabolic Complications of Antiretroviral therapy in a South African Black Population". She has a particular interest in the management of HIV disease and its intersection with noncommunicable diseases.

**Dr Sibongile Mashaphu** is a specialist psychiatrist and lecturer at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. She has a PhD in psychiatry and her research area of interest is HIV and mental health. In response to the UNAIDS 90 90 90 call for AIDS prevention, she joined forces with a research team from UCLA to develop an intervention for HIV risk-reduction in serodiscordant couples. She has publications on HIV and mental health and her future plans are to look at an intervention for teenagers and young people who were born with HIV through maternal transmission.
