Ms Shalo Mbatha is a Lecturer at the Department of History at the University of Zululand, South Africa. She was a Courseware developer at Technikon SA (now UNISA); Curriculum Developer in Tranby Aboriginal College in Sydney, Australia; a gualified Translator & Interpreter in German and Spanish; a published author of a ground breaking and best-seller history book about the Zulu nation called 'uZulu umlando nobuqhawe bukaZulu as well as the recently published book titled Zulu Empire Decolonised. She was advisor to the Zulu Royal Household based on her comprehensive Zulu history research.

Ms Mbatha worked at the Gauteng Film Commission responsible for marketing the province to the international film industry to shoot both films and adverts. She also worked in various government departments in strategic levels such as in the provincial department of Education in Limpopo & National Department of Arts and Culture; Gauteng Office of the Premier and Robben Island Museum. She has a sterling record as an investigative journalist and broke many stories that changed many people's lives. Amongst some of her achievements, a recipient of the Youth Development Trust Award; the Gauteng Women Trail Blazer Finalist award; the South African Special Envoy to Canada for four months; a member of the Presidential Fact-Finding Mission in Darfur, Sudan; the Media Fact Finding in Palestine and Israel; Rhodes University Courageous Journalist of the Year Finalist.

Ms Mbatha is a PhD Candidate (Zulu Feminism); has an MA (International Communication); BA Translation and Interpretation; Graduate Diploma in Education in Modern Languages in (German & Spanish); Certificate in Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL); Certificate in Public Relations (PRISA/Technikon SA now UNISA), Certificate in Investigative Journalism (Institute for Advancement of Journalism); Thinking & Planning Strategically (Wits Business School).
