Prof. Nthabiseng Motsemme is currently Director at the Centre for Sociological Research and Practice (CSRP) and Associate Professor in the Sociology Department, University of Johannesburg. She previously served as Academic Director at the National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences (NIHSS) and Director of Postgraduate Studies and Research Capacity Development at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. Prof. Motsemme holds a BA (UCT), MA in Race, Culture and Difference (Sussex, UK) and PhD (UNISA). Her research interests include African Feminist/Womanist Theories and Methodologies; Township Cultures and Subjectivities of Survival, Death and Healing; African Truth and Reconciliation Commissions and Gendering Violent Memories; and African Women's Experiences in Higher Education Transformation. She is Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Contemporary African Studies (JCAS), an editorial board member of the African Identities journal, and serves on the Taylor and Francis International Editorial Advisory Board.
