











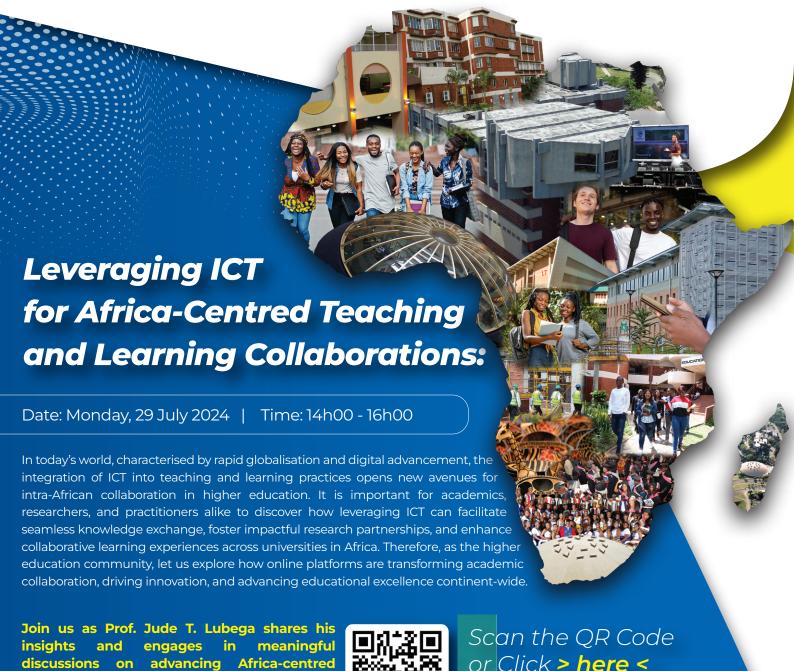

chaired the Task Force for the establishment of the Institute of IT Professionals in Uganda and served as a Director at UTAMU.
