The appointee will also work closely with other key support services and stakeholders. The successful candidate will be expected to work well under pressure and independently. The candidate should have high personal integrity and the ability to deal with sensitive issues delicately and diplomatically while maintaining complete discretion and confidentiality. The candidate should have good interpersonal and client service skills to enable successful liaison and interaction with all University stakeholders. The successful candidate must be proficient in English and IsiZulu. The incumbents will report to the College Head of Academic Monitoring and Support and the Dean of Teaching and Learning.

Minimum Requirements:

- A currently registered PhD student in the College of Humanities with evidence of being on track regarding the progression rules for doctoral studies (PhD completed can apply).
- At least three years of proven experience as a lecturer in a discipline in the College of Humanities with relevant experience in module development, module administration, module coordination, setting and marking assessments, Prior working experience in the Humanities Extended Curriculum Programme will be an advantage
- Experience undertaking research and administering, extracting and analysing all sources of data, with experience in preparing reports and presenting results
