The Orientation Coordinators work with and oversee the First-Year (FY) Orientation and Curriculum Advising (FYs and returning students) programmes in the College of Humanities. This will include virtual interaction and mode of delivery of the programmes. These student appointments are externally funded. The post is renewable, subject to the performance of the incumbent and the availability of external funding. The student appointment has no benefits attached to it. The appointee will also work closely with other key support services and stakeholders. The successful candidate will be expected to work well under pressure and independently. The candidate should have high personal integrity and the ability to deal with sensitive issues delicately and diplomatically while maintaining complete discretion and confidentiality. The candidate should have good interpersonal and client service skills to enable successful liaison and interaction with all University stakeholders. The incumbents will report to the College Head of Academic Monitoring and Support and the Dean of Teaching and Learning.

Minimum Requirements:

- A currently registered (as of 2024) PhD student in the College of Humanities
- At least two year of proven experience in academic and/ or curriculum advising, academic monitoring and support as a tutor and mentor and as a module tutor or lecturer
- Experience undertaking research and administering, extracting and analysing all sources of data, with experience in preparing reports and presenting results
- Relevant experience with Microsoft Office Suite, MS Teams/ Zoom, and Microsoft Outlook; with a good level of proficiency in word processing (MS Word), spreadsheets (MS Excel), and data analysis software such as SPSS
- Must be proficient in English, IsiZulu, or Nguni/other languages.
