



The Dell Development Fund (DDF) is committed to providing undergraduate students with the financial support they need to complete their studies in the fields of IT or Marketing. Here are some important details about the program:

- The DDF will notify the University or Organisation about the number of new bursaries available for the academic year. The program's budget may limit the number of bursaries awarded or prevent any from being awarded at all. The DDF will only cover the costs of existing students moving on to the next year of study.
- Even after receiving applications, the DDF reserves the right to not award new bursaries and will inform the University or Organisation accordingly. Bursaries are considered approved only after the DDF has notified both the University or Organisation and the student.
- The University or Organisation will be involved in the process of selecting candidates for the program. They can either shortlist applicants or recommend talented students from their existing system. Dell Computer (Pty) Ltd will make all final decisions regarding approved bursaries.
- Applicants must complete the application process and provide supporting documents to be considered for the program. Undergraduate diplomas and degrees must be in the fields of IT or Marketing. The bursary program will consider undergraduate studies for a maximum of four years, depending on the qualification. Students who fail an academic year will be terminated from the program.
- All the costs for an approved bursary will be processed for a purchase order on receipt of the invoice from the University or Organisation. Invoices will be requested after the University or Organisation's spreadsheet has been approved by DDF. The bursary program will cover the following costs (amounts are subject to change depending on budget):
 - a) Registration fees
 - b) Tuition
 - c) Textbooks (maximum value of R7,000.00 per annum)
 - d) Residence fees (maximum value of an approved on-campus residence)
 - e) Meals (standard meal tickets to the maximum value of the university meals)
 - f) Travel allowance (maximum value of R1,500.00 per month and only applicable to students who live at home and require travel to the university)
 - g) Dell laptop (only applicable to first-time Dell bursary students).
 - Bursary students are expected to volunteer their time to help others, as outlined in the bursary Memorandum of Understanding.
