The SARCHi chair for Inclusive Cities in the School of Built Environment and Development Studies (SoBEDS) is seeking for two highly motivated Master's Research Assistants. These successful candidates will contribute to the ongoing research activities focused on gender inclusion, migrants' inclusion, disability inclusion, and climate change as it relates to planning within our cities, among other research focus areas of the Chair. The research assistants will work under the day-to-day supervision of the SARCHi Chair for Inclusive Cities (Prof. Hope H. Magidimisha-Chipungu) assisting with research relevant to the Chair.

The incumbents will further support the Chair with data collection, data analysis, report writing, and presentations under supervision where necessary. The candidates are expected to collaborate with any relevant department/stakeholder working with the Chair and be able to adjust and contribute to a multidisciplinary team of researchers working with the Chair. They will be expected to recruit research participants and provide logistical support to the researchers and post-docs within the Chair. The research assistants will assist in any relevant tasks as and when required by their supervisor.

- Minimum 5 to 12 months work experience in research.

- Travelling experience in conveying site inspections and community engagements.
