

ABOUT THE MEMORIAL LECTURE

The Victoria and Griffiths Mxenge Memorial Lecture is held annually by the School of Law to honour the memory of Victoria and Griffiths Mxenge and the important roles they played in the struggle to liberate South Africans from the shackles of apartheid.

The first of these lectures was delivered by Nobel Laureate and the late former President Nelson Mandela at the erstwhile University of Natal in 1992.

Griffiths Mxenge was a graduate of the Faculty of Law. He and his wife Victoria Mxenge were brutally murdered by the apartheid security police in 1981 and 1985 respectively.
