Dr. Tigere Muringa is a distinguished multidisciplinary researcher with expertise in media, governance, and leadership. His robust publication record includes works on Al's role in journalism, such as *The Role of Artificial Intelligence in Contemporary Journalism Practice in Two African Countries*. Currently, he is collaborating with a team of developers and experts to develop customized Al research platforms for a South African university, designed to streamline research processes and enhance academic output. In 2025, Dr. Muringa travelled to the United States of America to engage with universities on developing frameworks for integrating Al into research methodologies and academic curricula, further solidifying his expertise in Al-driven research innovation. His extensive experience in facilitating workshops, such as *Mastering The Art of Literature Review with Al Tools*, makes him uniquely qualified to lead this session. To date, he has trained over 200 academics on how to use Al in their research processes ethically.
