His robust publication record includes works on AI's role in journalism, such as *The Role of Artificial Intelligence in Contemporary Journalism Practice in Two African Countries*. Currently, he is collaborating with a team of developers and experts to develop customized AI research platforms for a South African university, designed to streamline research processes and enhance academic output. In 2025, Dr. Muringa travelled to the United States of America to engage with universities on developing frameworks for integrating AI into research methodologies and academic curricula, further solidifying his expertise in AI-driven research innovation. His extensive experience in facilitating workshops, such as *Mastering The Art of Literature Review with AI Tools*, makes him uniquely qualified to lead this session. To date, he has trained over 200 academics on how to use AI in their research processes ethically.
