The African Research, Implementation Science, and Education (ARISE) Network is based at the Centre for Research in Health Systems (CRH) within the School of Nursing and Public Health at the University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN). It is a multi-country research network focused on adolescent health. In collaboration with Heidelberg University and the Technical University of Munich in Germany, and Harvard University in the USA, ARISE is currently implementing two projects: NUTRINT and DASH.

NUTRINT (Policies in Sub-Saharan Africa and Reducing Nutrition-Related Noncommunicable Diseases in Adolescence and Youth) is funded by the EU Horizon programme and aims to improve nutrition and healthy lifestyles among adolescents in Sub-Saharan Africa by examining policies and interventions that enhance nutrition knowledge, diet quality, and reduce the risk of diet-related diseases.

The DASH project (Research Network for Design and Evaluation of Adolescent Health Interventions and Policies in Sub-Saharan Africa) focuses on identifying nutrition-related non-communicable disease risk factors among adolescents and young adults. It involves the co-design of integrated nutrition, mental health, and sexual and reproductive health interventions, and evaluates their effectiveness and cost-effectiveness to inform evidence-based and scalable adolescent health policies across the region.

The South African ARISE Network is recruiting two Research Assistants for a period of 10 months to support the implementation of both projects in line with study protocols and ethical requirements. The positions will be based mainly at the ARISE offices at Howard College, with additional work at the USINGA HDSS site (wards 79 and 82) in Umlazi township, Durban, as needed.
