Consequently, examining the resilience of businesses and financial markets in the face of trade instability and geopolitical shocks has emerged as a central and enduring focus of contemporary research.



KEYNOTE SPEAKER


Professor Jonathan Calof is the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Co-Chair on Anticipatory Systems for Innovation and Venture Creation and is widely recognized as a global leader in intelligence and foresight, particularly for applying these disciplines to innovation, government policy, economic development, and business start-ups through his “Future Proof for Today™” approach.

A Full Professor of International Business and Strategy at the Telfer School of Management, University of Ottawa, Dr. Calof integrates research and consulting in competitive intelligence, foresight, collective intelligence, and business analytics to help organizations build anticipatory systems that generate actionable insights about future environments and support innovation readiness. In 2025, he was honoured in the Senate of Canada with the King Charles III Coronation Medal in recognition of his distinguished academic career and service as UNESCO Co-Chair, specifically cited for his expertise in competitive intelligence and foresight and his contributions to innovation and venture creation.



Dr. Calof has delivered more than 1,000 speeches, seminars, and keynote presentations globally and has advised numerous corporations and government agencies on strengthening their intelligence, foresight, and analytics capabilities. In recognition of his impact on advancing evidence-based decision-making, he has received multiple honours, including the Lifetime Achievement Award in Competitive Intelligence from Frost & Sullivan and the Distinguished Member Award and Competitive Intelligence Fellow designation from Strategic and Competitive Intelligence Professionals (SCIP), alongside honorary professorships from several universities and numerous community service awards. A prolific scholar, he has authored more than 250 publications and serves on the editorial boards of several journals and professional magazines in competitive intelligence and foresight.

He has represented major banking institutions in high-profile business rescue proceedings in KwaZulu-Natal, including the Gledhow Sugar Mill rescue, and is currently advising key stakeholders and undertaking scenario planning in the Tongaat Hulett business rescue. He is a member of the South African Rescue and Insolvency Practitioners Association and has presented on business rescue at its annual seminar.
