Application Guide for SARAO Freestanding BSc and BEng Undergraduate Scholarships for 2027

READ THE ENTIRE GUIDE BEFORE APPLYING FOR A SCHOLARSHIP

Closing Date for Applications: 14 August 2026

1. Eligibility for SARAO Undergraduate Scholarships

1.1. Eligibility: Nationality

SARAO will only consider applications from South African citizens and permanent residents

1.2. Eligibility: Undergraduate Degree

SARAO will only consider applications from students who are currently studying, or who plan to study, any of the following degrees at a South African university:

- Bachelor of Electronic Engineering
- Bachelor of Electrical Engineering
- Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering
- Bachelor of Mechatronic Engineering
- Bachelor of Computer Engineering
- Bachelor of Science in Physics and Mathematics/Applied Mathematics
- Bachelor of Science in Physics and Electronics
- Bachelor of Science in Physics and Astronomy/Astrophysics
- Bachelor of Science in Computer Science and Mathematics/Applied Mathematics

1.3. Eligibility: Academic Results

- For students who wish to study any of the engineering degrees listed in 2.2, a minimum of 70% in Mathematics in Grade 12, or a minimum grade point average of 65% at undergraduate level, is required for their application to be considered.

- For students who wish to study any of the science degrees listed in 2.2, a minimum of 70% in Mathematics and Physical Science in Grade 12, or a minimum grade-point average of 65% at undergraduate level, is required for their application to be considered.

Note:

- (i) For students currently in Grade 12, applications will be evaluated based on their final Grade 11 results and/or most recent Grade 12 results. If a student currently in Grade 12 is offered a SRAO undergraduate scholarship based on their final Grade 11 and/or most recent Grade 12 results, fails to achieve the minimum academic requirements upon completion of Grade 12, the scholarship offer will be revoked.
- (i) For students currently studying towards one of the degrees listed in 2.2, applications will be evaluated based on their most recent university results. If a student currently enrolled in one the degrees listed in 2.2 is offered a SRAO undergraduate scholarship based on their current university results, fails to achieve a minimum of 65% at the end of their current year of study, the scholarship offer will be revoked.

2. How to apply for a SRAO Freestanding Undergraduate Scholarship

- 2.1. Application forms are accessible online at <https://nrfconnect.nrf.ac.za>
- 2.2. Complete the Profile section first
- 2.3. From MY APPLICATIONS, select Undergraduate and Diploma Scholarships, then select SRAO Undergraduate Scholarship
- 2.4. Students may only submit ONE application.
- 2.5. Students MUST upload all **THREE** required documents (see Section 3), in the Attachments Section of the application form. **IF ANY OF THESE THREE DOCUMENTS ARE NOT ATTACHED TO YOUR APPLICATION, SRAO WILL NOT CONSIDER YOUR APPLICATION.**
- 2.6. Your application must be supported by at least two letters of reference (see Section 4). **IF YOUR APPLICATION IS NOT SUPPORTED BY TWO LETTERS OF REFERENCE SRAO WILL NOT CONSIDER YOUR APPLICATION**
- 2.7. Once you submit your application, it will automatically be routed to the institution where you are applying to study.

You MUST upload **ALL THREE** documents listed below, in the **Attachments Section** of the application form.

Letter of Motivation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The letter of motivation is CRITICAL for the review of your application. - Take the time to draft an excellent motivation! - Your motivation could be the deciding factor in whether you are awarded a scholarship or not. (DO NOT USE AI). - You must provide a letter of about 500 words motivating why you should be awarded a SARAQ Undergraduate Scholarship. In this letter you should include the following information: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Your academic progress at school and/or at undergraduate level. - The school subjects and/or the undergraduate courses that interested you the most, and why. - Details of academic achievements. - Why you chose to study the degree you are studying, or have selected to study, and how this degree is relevant to a career in radio astronomy. - Your personal strengths, passions and career aspirations. - Other achievements and interests beyond your studies. - Any community outreach work you may have been involved in.

4. !! Letters of Reference!!

- 4.1. Your application must be supported by **TWO** letters of reference.
- 4.2. Where possible, one of the two reference letters should be written by a teacher or university lecturer.
- 4.3. Members of your family and your friends may NOT write a letter of reference on your behalf.
- 4.4. Referees must send the letters of reference to **study.research@sarao.ac.za** before **14 August 2026**.
- 4.5. Please ask the referees to include the following information about you, in their letters of reference:
 - How the referee knows you, and for how long they have known you.
 - Your academic performance, and attitude to your studies.
 - Your potential to succeed at an undergraduate level.
 - Notable attributes, skills or accomplishments that the referee has observed, or is aware of.
 - Any other relevant information about you that the referee may wish to bring to SARAQ’s attention.

5. Funding Levels and Period of Support for SARAQ Freestanding Undergraduate Scholarships

- 5.1. The 2027 SARAQ Undergraduate scholarship level is R183,000.
- 5.2. Students are also eligible for a once-off laptop grant of R13,000.
- 5.3. For Bachelor of Engineering degrees, the duration of a South African Radio Astronomy Observatory (SARAQ) undergraduate scholarship is one year for fourth-year students, two years for third-year students, three years for second-year students and four years for first-year students.
- 5.4. For Bachelor of Science degrees, the duration of a South African Radio Astronomy Observatory (SARAQ) undergraduate scholarship is one year for third-year students, two years for second-year students, and three years for first-year students
